- POSITION:** Temporary position as a Visiting Assistant Professor in Secondary Mathematics Education. **WOMEN AND MINORITIES ARE ENCOURAGED TO APPLY.**
- RESPONSIBILITIES:** Responsibilities will include: teaching a range of methods courses for prospective secondary and middle grade mathematics teachers, as well as courses in the graduate mathematics education program; supervising field experiences and student teaching; collaborating with public schools and participating in ongoing outreach projects. The Department of Curriculum and Teaching is a supportive and collaborative academic environment.
- REQUIREMENTS/
QUALIFICATIONS:** **Required:** Earned doctorate in Mathematics Education or a related field, including a strong graduate mathematics component, is required if appointment is ranked visiting assistant professor. Doctoral candidates who have completed their coursework and collected their data for their dissertation may be considered at the rank of visiting instructor. Candidates must have a commitment to teacher education, excellence in teaching, and continued scholarly activity; and at least two years of successful experience teaching mathematics in U.S. schools, grades 6-12.
- Preferred:** Evidence of accomplishment in teaching, research, and service; and at least three years of successful experience teaching mathematics in U.S. schools, grades 6-12. Experiences with educational technology and multicultural education are desirable.
- RANK AND SALARY:** Visiting Assistant Professor or Instructor (non-tenure track) at a salary commensurate with experience and other qualifications.
- APPLICATION PROCESS:** Send letter of application, resume, official undergraduate and graduate transcripts, and three letters of recommendation to address below. Candidate selected for this position must be able to meet eligibility requirements to work in the U.S. at the time the appointment is scheduled to begin and continue working legally for the proposed term of employment and must be able to communicate effectively in English. Screening will begin on October 15, 2007, and will continue until the position is filled.
