_____Teaching Assistant, ¼ time - COUN 1000, Career Exploration and Planning

Duties: Teaching curriculum designed to help undeclared freshmen and sophomores in planning careers. Adapting lesson plans from provided curriculum, evaluating students, and maintaining office hours. Must have completed a minimum of 18 graduate credit hours to qualify.

_____Teaching Assistant, ¼ time - COUN 3100, Counseling & Human Services

Duties: Teaching undergraduate course in facilitating helping relations. This position entails adapting lesson plans from modified curriculum, evaluating students, and maintaining office hours. Must have completed a minimum of 18 graduate credit hours to qualify.

_____Student Affairs Assistant, ¼ time

Several assistantships are available. These assistantships may include positions in the offices/departments of Academic Support, Freshman Year Experience, Student Counseling Services, Career Development, and Supplemental Instruction.

_____Athletic Department Assistant, ¼ time

Duties: Identifying needs of athletes and implementing programs. Generally requires a Master's degree.

Assisting with grants or contracts that provide assistance to communities in need.
